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### **CCSD Refers Students to Nevada Youth Website for Job Searches**

Las Vegas, NV —Students in southern Nevada will be directed to use Nevada JobConnect’s job bank for employment searches when the Clark County School District shuts down its job bank on October 31. Additionally, employers who would normally post jobs with the district are asked to post job announcements suitable for young people at [www.NevadaYouth.org](http://www.NevadaYouth.org), the state’s youth employment website.

With youth age 16-24 having the highest unemployment rate of any group at 16.9 percent, we recognize the importance of focusing on helping this population improve its employment outlook.”

The Nevada Youth website provides such information as resume writing and interviewing tips, labor statistics, weekly job announcements and resources for education and training.
