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### **DETR to Hold Kick Off Events for Program to Help Long Term Unemployed**

Reno, NV —The Nevada Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation (DETR) will hold a business lunch, discussion and orientation on Feb. 2 at noon to officially kick off Platform to Employment (P2E), a nationally recognized program addressing the specific needs of long-term unemployed workers. It will be held at Reno KNPB at 1670 N. Virginia St., Reno, NV 89503.

The two-part event will welcome the first cohort selected in Northern Nevada. Media are invited to attend. The kick-off will include remarks by DETR officials and P2E executives. An overview of the P2E program goals and expectations will also be provided.

P2E is specifically for individuals who have been unemployed 27 or more weeks or have exhausted their unemployment benefits, said Renee Olson, administrator for DETR's Employment Security Division. Nevada currently has about 41,000 long term unemployed.

“While Nevada’s unemployment rate continues to fall, there are still many Nevadans who have been unemployed for long periods of time. The Employment Security Division is working diligently to provide assistance to the long term unemployed,” said Renee Olson, administrator for DETR’s Employment Security Division. “P2E is an excellent program that we are pleased to have in Nevada.”

Nevada was among 32 states to be awarded a grant from the U.S. Department of Labor to assist Nevada’s long-term unemployed jobseekers in re-entering the workforce, Olson said. The grant totaling \$1,830,497 was awarded through the Job-Driven National Emergency Grant program.

DETR is partnering with The WorkPlace, southwestern Connecticut’s regional Workforce Development Board, to bring P2E to Northern Nevada. P2E offers individuals a five-week preparatory program, including skills assessment, career readiness

workshops, employee assistance programs, coaching and more. After completing the program, P2E assists participants in finding employment.

Placements are made on a trial basis, and are paid for by the program. The expectation is a fulltime job will result, if the employer is satisfied with the performance of the candidate, Olson said. P2E subsidizes the wages of the job candidate for up to eight weeks, providing employers a risk-free opportunity to evaluate the candidate and determine if a good match exists.

P2E is a proven model that demonstrates that the right job readiness programming, combined with personal and family support services and financial counseling, can return the long-term unemployed to the workforce. Tested in multiple cohorts, including participants from urban and suburban communities, P2E has placed 80 percent of program participants into work experience programs, with nearly 90 percent of these individuals moving on to full-time employment, added Joseph Carbone, President and CEO of The WorkPlace.

“Platform to Employment provides the tools and resources needed to return the long-term unemployed to work,” Carbone said. “The program provides hope and opportunity for workers that are frequently overlooked when hiring, and we look forward to beginning work in Reno.”

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DETR is comprised of the Employment Security Division, Equal Rights Commission, Rehabilitation Division, and the Research and Analysis Bureau. DETR works in partnership with the Nevada JobConnect System to provide training and job placement services to job seekers and to assist employers in hiring practices. It also supports economic development efforts through improving Nevada's workforce.
