Las Vegas and Reno Areas' Unemployment Rates Rose Slightly in May

CARSON CITY, NV—The unemployment rates in May in the state's metropolitan statistical areas varied relative to April, but dropped over the year. The rate in Las Vegas rose to 6.4 percent, but is down 0.2 percentage points from last year. Over-the-year, the rate in the Reno/Sparks area rose slightly to 5.5 percent. Carson City's rate fell both annually and over the month to 6.5 percent. For the month of May, all of the counties have an unemployment rate below 9 percent.

"The upward movement in the largest metro area rates mirrored the statewide increase to 6.1 percent (seasonally adjusted) reported last week," said Bill Anderson, chief economist for Nevada's Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation. "Despite the employment decline over-the-month, each of the state's population centers gained jobs on a year-over-year basis. Monthly volatility is not cause for concern, as the Silver State's labor market continues to show positive signs with record employment growth."

NEVADA SUB-STATE LABOR MARKET OVERVIEW



In May, Statewide employment estimates were relatively weak, decreasing by a seasonally adjusted 3,800, relative to April. The decline in the State's job numbers over-the-month, lead to employment decreases in all of the metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs). Las Vegas is down 200 jobs; the result of a 2,300 job increase in payrolls (not adjusted for seasonality), when an increase of 2,500 jobs was expected. In Reno/Sparks, we expected payrolls to increase by 1,800



jobs; however, jobs actually increased by 800, leading to a seasonally adjusted decrease of 1,000 jobs. Finally, Carson City job numbers were expected to increase by 300 jobs, but actually realized an increase of 200 jobs. Consequently, there was a seasonally adjusted decrease of 100 jobs this month in the State capital.



Despite the employment decline over-the-month, each of the State's population centers gained jobs on a year-over-year basis. Las Vegas was home to the highest nominal growth, 21,300 jobs, an increase of 2.3 percent, relative to May 2015. Specifically, goods-producing industries added 6,500 jobs and service providers added



13,100¹. In Reno/Sparks, service providers increased significantly, with a year-over-year increase of 6,200 jobs, and goods-producing employment added 1,000 jobs to payrolls. All told, growth in the Reno/Sparks area totaled 7,300 jobs, up 3.5 percent from May last year. Carson City added 100 jobs year-over-year. In the State as a whole, job numbers increased two percent year-over-year, adding a seasonally adjusted 25,100 jobs.

Inflow/outflow analysis shows the count² and characteristics of worker flows into, out of, and within the selected study area. In May, we look at the percentage of workers employed and living in the same county for 2014. The State's largest employment centers have the highest percentage of workers in this category, at 93.9 percent for Clark (821,500 workers), and


² Job counts include all public and private sector jobs covered by state unemployment insurance systems for the most current year available.

³ The State's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate is 6.1 percent in May, up from 5.8 percent in April and down from 6.8 percent in May 2015. Unemployment rates for the State's metropolitan areas and counties reported here are not adjusted for seasonality. Hence, comparisons to the State's seasonally adjusted rate should be avoided. Legitimate comparisons, however, can be made to the State's unadjusted rate - 6.2 percent in April, up from 6.1 percent in April and down from 6.6 percent in May 2015.

80.9 percent for Washoe (158,400 workers). Elko is also notable, with 72.3 percent of locals working within the county, totaling 18,100 persons. Storey has the lowest percentage of these workers, with only 190 residents working within the county, or 5.6 percent.


This month, the unemployment rates in the State's metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs) varied on a month-over-month basis but decreased year-over-year³. The rate in Las Vegas is up 0.3 percentage point from April, at 6.4 percent, but is down 0.2 percentage points from last year. Over-the-year, the rate in the Reno/Sparks area decreased 0.7 percentage point, to 5.5 percent, but is up 0.1 percentage point over-the-month. The only MSA to decrease on both a monthly and yearly basis was Carson City. Relative to last month, the State capital is down 0.2 percentage point; further, over-the-year the rate declined 0.5 percentage point, for an unemployment rate of 6.5 percent.

Unemployment rates are below nine percent for all of the Silver State's counties, in May.



Rates ranged from 4.7 percent in White Pine to 8.9 percent in Mineral. In addition to White Pine, relatively low unemployment rates are also found in Elko and Eureka, at 4.8 percent and 4.9 percent, respectively. The highest unemployment rates, other than Mineral, belong to Nye (8.1 percent) and Lyon (eight percent).

Year-to-date, online job posting activity⁴ is up in 15 of 17 counties in May. Clark job postings increased more than any other county (+9,300) at 65,800 ads, up from 56,500 during the same time period last year. Washoe also realized significant growth in postings, with an increase of 4,400 ads, totaling 17,500 postings. Eureka and Lander realized over-the-year declines in job postings. Eureka declined more than any other county, with 31 less postings than last year.


