Nevada's Metro Areas Experience More Job Growth in February

CARSON CITY, NV — Reno/Sparks unemployment rate fell to 4.6 percent in February, while the rate in Las Vegas remained steady at 5.1 percent and held at 5.9 percent in Carson City. The statewide unemployment rate was recently reported at a seasonally adjusted 4.9 percent.

“A more accurate indication of the state’s economic health is measured on an annual basis which shows the metro areas continuing to add jobs, with the unemployment rates down,” said Bill Anderson, chief economist for Nevada’s Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation. “All metro areas experienced job growth over the year, some seasonally-adjusted losses were experienced over the month.”

- Washoe County: 0.7 percentage point decrease, from 5.3 percent to 4.6 percent.
- Carson City: 0.8 percentage point decrease, from 6.7 percent to 5.9 percent.

NEVADA SUB-STATE LABOR MARKET OVERVIEW

February 2017

Job growth remained strong throughout Nevada in February despite mixed gains in the metro areas. Although all areas saw nominal increases in employment, Las Vegas gained only 2,800 jobs when 3,700 were expected based upon historical trends. This resulted in a seasonally-adjusted loss of 900 for the metropolitan statistical area (MSA). In Reno/Sparks, 2,200 jobs were added with only 1,900 expected, resulting in a seasonally-adjusted gain of 300 jobs. Finally, Carson City added 400 to payrolls when only 300 were expected, resulting in

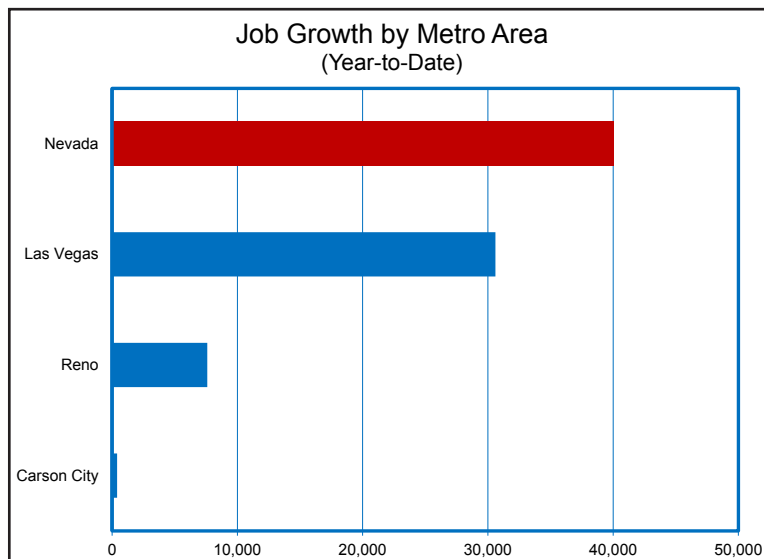

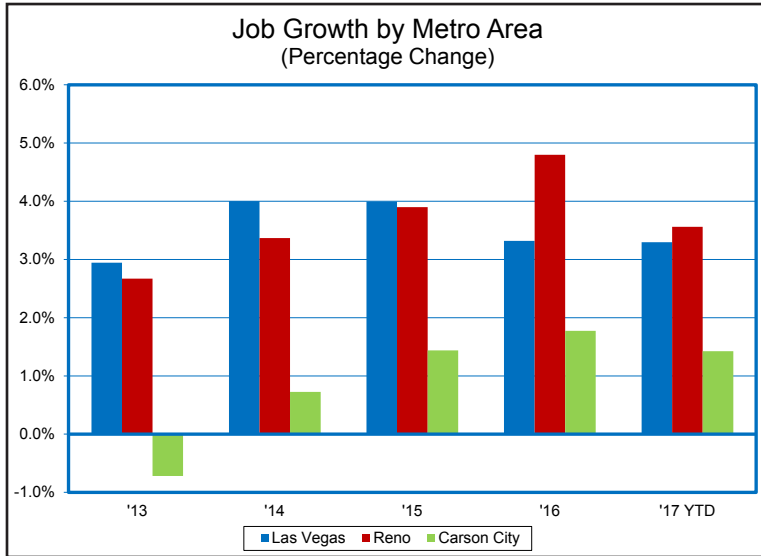
a seasonally-adjusted increase of 100 jobs.

Over the year, employment gains were positive across the State and all three MSAs. Nevada has added 41,200 jobs since February of 2016, a growth rate of 3.2 percent.

In Las Vegas, employment has increased by 29,900 since last year, growing at the same rate as the State. This corresponds to 4,600 new goods-producing jobs and 25,600 service-providing jobs added in the area¹. In Reno/Sparks, 7,700 jobs were added over the year, a growth rate of 3.5 percent. Goods producers gained 1,300 jobs while service providers increased employment by six thousand. Carson City has gained 800 jobs since last year, with no change to goods-producing employment



¹ References to total MSA employment are adjusted for seasonality, whereas references to goods-producing and service-providing industries are not.



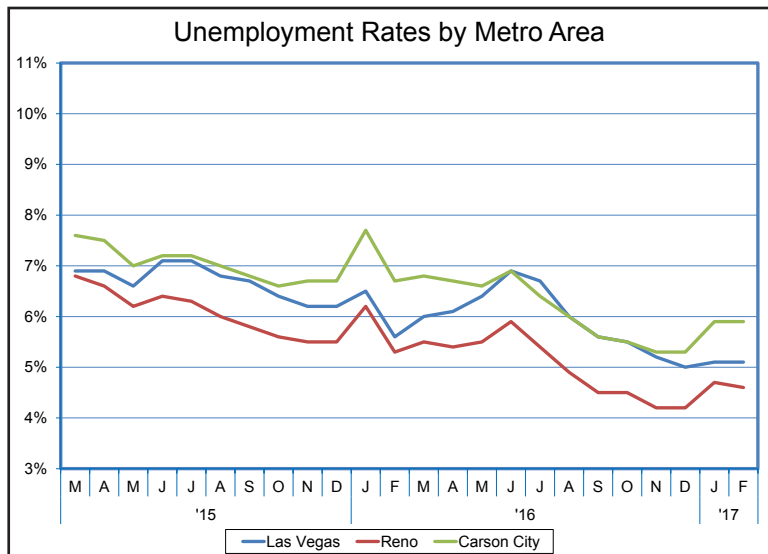
and 600 new service-providing jobs. This is a 2.8 percent growth rate for the MSA.

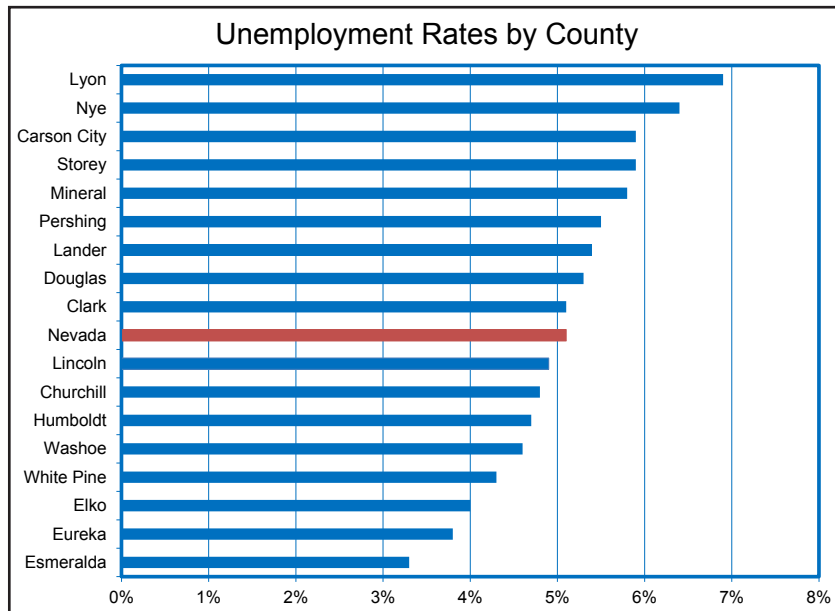
Information obtained through the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) program provide a nearly complete job count based on quarterly wage records submitted by employers whose employees are covered by the Unemployment Insurance System. Because generating this data is a time-consuming process, it is only available with a four-to-five month lag. The most recent QCEW information shows that total employment in Nevada as a whole increased 3.2 percent over the first nine months of 2016, relative to the same period in the preceding year. At the county level, job growth ranged from -6.6 percent in Esmeralda to 32.1 percent in Mineral over the study period. As for Nevada's major population centers, Clark recorded growth of 3.2 percent over this period, the same as the State as a whole. Washoe recorded growth of 4.5 percent, a full percentage point ahead of the State average. Finally, Carson City recorded a 1.4 percent growth rate.

The same data from QCEW show employment in firms with less than

100 employees (our definition of "small business") accounted for 53 percent of total private sector employment in Nevada during the third quarter of 2016. Small business establishments accounted for more than half of total employment in 12 of 17 counties. The lowest rates were found in Eureka and Lander at 8.4 percent and 36.6 percent respectively. This is certainly attributable to the presence of large mining operations in these counties. In Esmeralda and Lincoln, one hundred percent of employment was in establishments with less than 100 employees, in the absence of any large employers in these counties. The share of total employment accounted for by small business has increased since 2010:1Q (the lowest point in the recession) in 11 of the 17 counties. As for Nevada's major population centers, Clark came in at 49.7 percent, slightly below the Statewide average. Carson City was at 76.3 percent and Washoe at 61.9 percent, both higher than in the State as a whole.

Data from the QCEW program also show that Nevada wages averaged \$949 per week Statewide. Weekly wages ranged from \$715 (Lincoln) to \$1,731 (Eureka). Six counties





est rates for two months in a row. The largest over-the-month declines from January were found in Churchill (-0.7 percentage point), Lander (-0.6 percentage point), and Eureka (-0.4 percentage point). The only counties to experience an increase in the unemployment rate since last month were Mineral and Storey, where the rates increased by 0.1 and 0.3 percentage point, respectively.

recorded average weekly wages in excess of \$1000 in 2016:IIIQ. This can be attributed to the high concentration of mining jobs in these counties. As for Nevada's major population centers, all three fell just below the Statewide reading. Average weekly wages in Carson City and Clark were both at \$947. Washoe recorded average wages of \$932.

Initial claims for unemployment insurance (UI) at the county level are largely down thus far in 2017. Year-to-date, all but one of Nevada's counties, Storey, has experienced declines in initial claims relative to last year. Thirteen of those counties saw declines of ten percent or more. On a nominal basis, Clark has seen the largest decline, with 3,030 fewer claims than last year. This is fol-

Statewide, the unemployment rate stands at just 4.9 percent in February. Across the MSAs, Reno/Sparks has the lowest rate at 4.6 percent², down 0.2 percentage point from January. Las Vegas, at 5.1 percent, and Carson City, at 5.9 percent, experienced no change in the jobless rate over the month.

Across Nevada's counties, February unemployment ranges from a low of 3.3 percent in Esmeralda to a high of 6.9 percent in Lyon. Eureka and Elko, at 3.8 and four percent respectively, join Esmeralda with the low-

² The State's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate is 4.9 percent in February, down from 5.0 percent in January and down from 6.1 percent in February 2016. Unemployment rates for the State's metropolitan areas and counties reported here are not adjusted for seasonality. Hence, comparisons to the State's seasonally adjusted rate should be avoided. Legitimate comparisons, however, can be made to the State's unadjusted rate - 5.1 percent in February, down from 6.2 percent in February 2016 and with no change over the month.

lowed by Washoe and Elko counties which have seen respective nominal declines of 250 and 140 initial claims.

Year-to-date online job posting activity³ is mixed amongst Nevada's counties this month, with Douglas (+340), Elko (+232), and Nye (+144) experiencing the largest increases in ad volume over last year. Carson City has also experienced positive growth, with 1,300 ads, an increase of 44 over this time last year. Clark and Washoe have seen fewer online job postings so far this year, with Clark at 22,100 total ads through February and Washoe with 6,000.

³ Online job postings are obtained through DETR's Silver State Solutions initiative. Online job posting volume does not necessarily correlate with the level of job openings or hiring. Internal company hiring and union hiring are often not captured by online ads. High ad volume often occurs for occupations/industries that are having difficulty finding qualified candidates, high turnover positions/recurring openings, or when companies are building large candidate pools. Online job postings should only be used with caution when developing/analyzing time series trends due to the constant changes in the rate of online advertising usage and in the methods used for collecting the data.

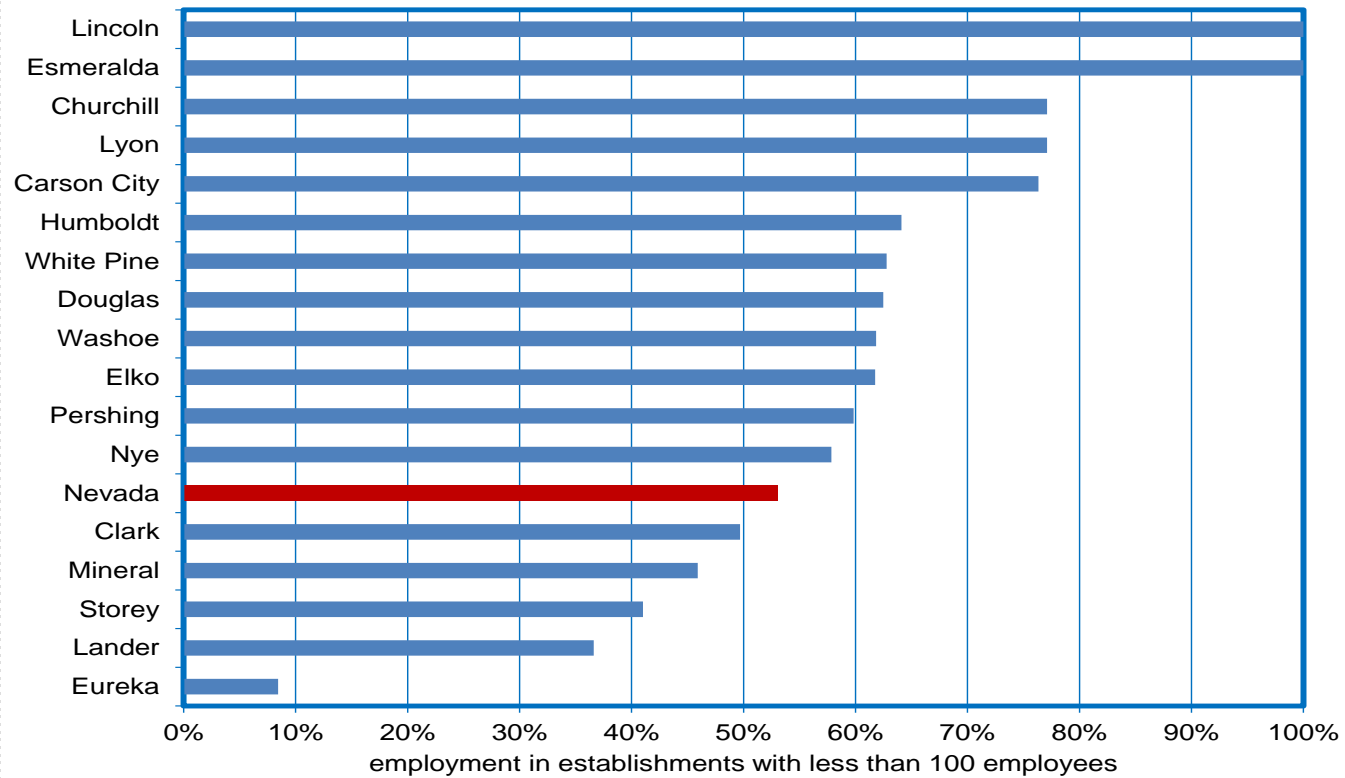

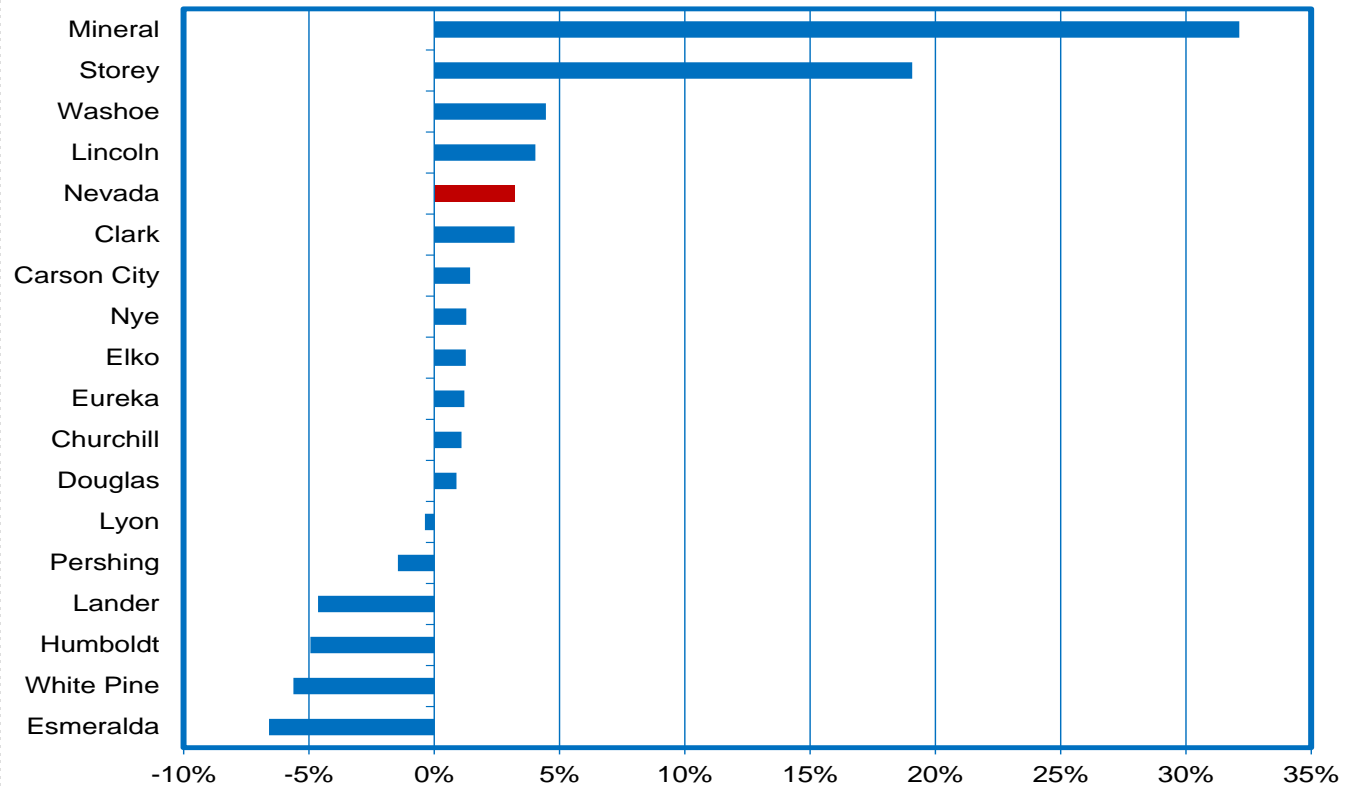

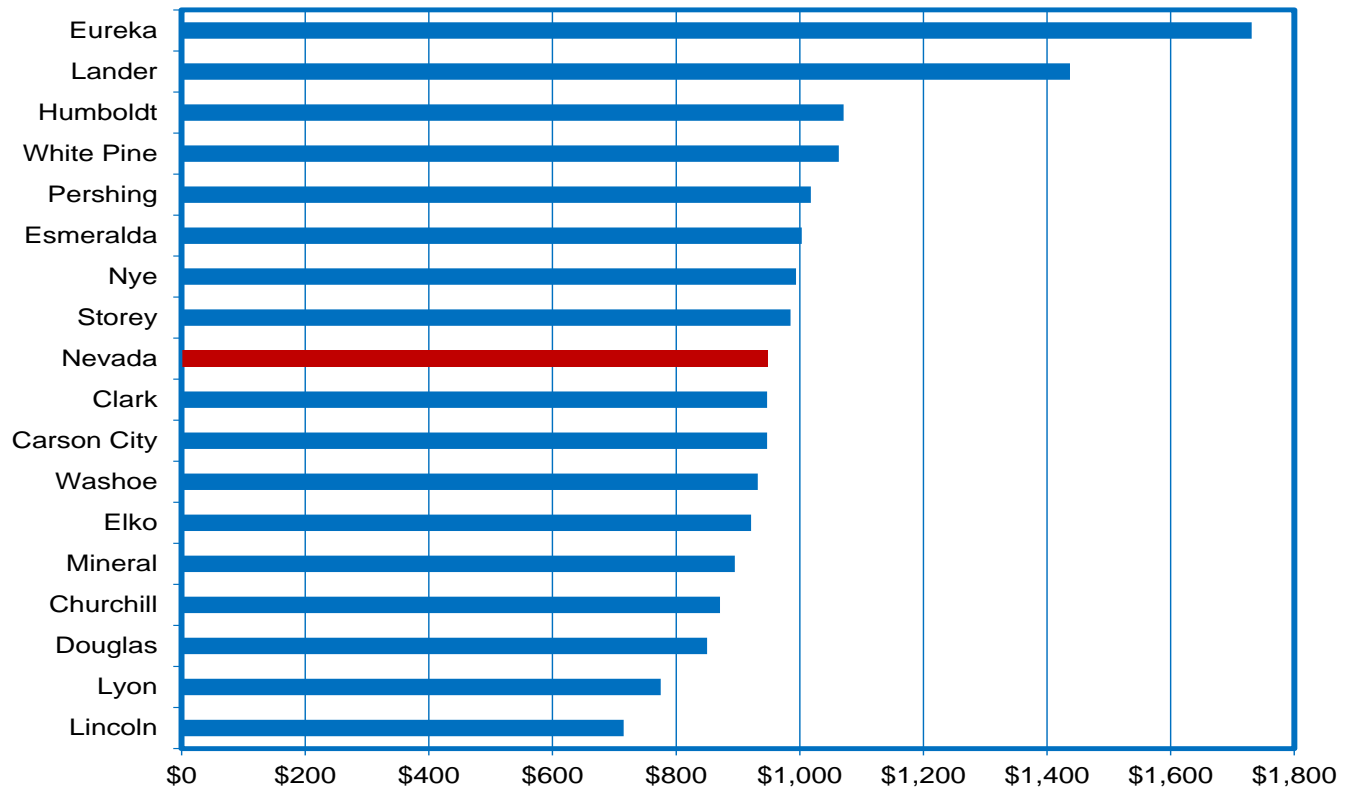
Small Business Accounts for More than Half of Total Private Sector Employment in 12 of 17 Counties
