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Nevada's Unemployment Rate Falls to 9.3 Percent in September

Carson City, NV —The unemployment rate for September registered at a seasonally adjusted 9.3 percent, down from 9.5 percent in August. This is the lowest jobless rate since December 2008.

“I am pleased to see the improvement Nevada’s labor market is making, with September’s unemployment rate hitting the lowest point in five years,” said Governor Brian Sandoval. “We have made great strides in our economic development efforts, but recognize the need to continue the momentum so that all of Nevada’s unemployed have the opportunity to return to work.”

While the state lost 8,800 jobs in September, year over year, the number of jobs is up by 1.4 percent and up 1.9 percent over the first nine months of the year, said Bill Anderson, chief economist for Nevada’s Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation. Due to the government shutdown, unemployment rates for the metropolitan state areas will not be available until November 22nd, but employment numbers are available. Las Vegas employment fell by 7,600 jobs, but is up by 1.9 percent year over year. Reno-Sparks employment fell by 600 jobs, but has a total gain of .5 percent relative to last year. Carson City added 200 jobs, the largest increase since June.

Separate surveys are used to calculate job losses and the unemployment rate, which explains how the state could register a drop in the unemployment rate in September, while having lost jobs.

“A more accurate measure of the health of the economy comes from examining the annual trends rather than the month to month activity,” Anderson said. “Overall, the state is moving in a positive direction, with the unemployment rate continuing to fall and employers continuing to add jobs.”

NEVADA LABOR MARKET OVERVIEW September 2013, Part II

Employment levels for September in the State of Nevada have continued the monthly growth-decline pattern that we highlighted in last month's *Labor Market Overview*. Job readings are down a seasonally adjusted 8,800 for September, a decrease of 0.8 percent from August of this year. Should recent trends continue, we would expect a more positive report in October, following September's monthly decline. Still, September results represent a year-over-year increase of 1.4 percent, relative to September of 2012. Further, if we consider the year-to-date change, job levels are up 1.9 percent over the first nine months of the year, relative to the same period in 2012.


The unemployment rate for the State of Nevada fell to 9.3 percent on a seasonally adjusted basis in September. This is down from the August reading of 9.5 percent. This equates to a decrease of over 3,000 individuals previously considered unemployed, and marks the lowest reading since December 2008. Employment in the State's largest MSA, Las Vegas, fell by 7,600 jobs. This still leads to a year-over-year increase of 1.9 percent, relative to September 2012. The Reno-Sparks area experienced a loss of 600 jobs; still up 0.5 percent relative to last year. Finally, Carson City added 200 jobs, the largest increase in the area since June of this year; though employment in the State Capital is still down 1.1 percent, relative to September of 2012.

The State's largest sector, leisure and hospitality, added 200 jobs over the month, leading to a year-over-year increase of 2.4 percent. The construction industry added 100 jobs over the month, a one percent increase over the year. The trade, transportation, and utilities sector lost 600 jobs, though the sector has still added 2.5 percent to employment levels relative to September 2012. The sector which experienced the largest job loss over the month was professional and business services, down 7,500 jobs, a decline of 4.3 percent relative to September 2012. This is the largest decline in this sector since 2003, and appears to have been driven by convention and trade show organizers.

Surging exports in 2011 and 2012 aided Nevada's economic recovery as money flowed into the State for products ranging from gold to gaming machines.

Although the value of our exports stalled in 2013, due to a fall in gold prices, new opportunities await around the world. Nevada sends over two-thirds of its total value of goods to just three countries — Switzerland, India, and Canada. Nearly all purchases made by Switzerland are in the primary metal (gold) category, and the majority of Canada’s purchases fall under both mining output and miscellaneous manufacturing (gaming machines). With exports rising sharply from 2011 to 2012, to a value of \$430M, India is a relatively new player for Nevada’s exporting community. Again, the top products of interest are in the primary metals and miscellaneous manufactured goods categories. Overall, Nevada-made goods and services reached over 170 countries worldwide in 2012.
