## **Nevada's Metro Areas Unemployment Rates Down in July**

CARSON CITY, NV—In July, the unemployment rates in the metro areas fell month over month and on an annual basis. The Las Vegas unemployment rate dropped to 6.7 percent, while Reno/Sparks fell to 5.5 percent. The Carson City unemployment rate registered at 6.5 percent.

All county unemployment rates decreased except Esmeralda and are below 10 percent, said Bill Anderson, chief economist for Nevada's Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation.

"Year-over-year employment increased or remained steady across the state's population centers," Anderson said. "Statewide, Nevada experienced a seasonally adjusted growth rate of 2.5 percent, or 31,900 added jobs, relative to last July. This continues to be an indication that the Silver State is headed to prerecession levels in terms of the number of jobs."

## NEVADA SUB-STATE LABOR MARKET OVERVIEW


### July 2016

In July, the Silver State's employment estimates experienced a seasonally adjusted gain of 4,700 jobs relative to June. This growth was shared by all three of the metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs) in the State. Las Vegas payroll employment is up by a seasonally adjusted 3,400 jobs. This seasonally adjusted total is a result of a dip in payrolls of only 3,100 jobs when the expected loss due to seasonal fluctuations was 6,500 (largely from decreases in public sector employment as schools let out for the summer). In Reno/Sparks, payrolls were expected to decrease by 1,600 jobs but only ac-



tually went down by an estimated 200, leading to a seasonally adjusted gain of 1,400 jobs. Finally, Carson City experienced no change in payroll employment after an expected decrease of 100 jobs; as a result, the State Capital's employment increased by a seasonally adjusted 100 jobs.



Year-over-year employment increased or remained steady across the State's population centers. Statewide, Nevada experienced a seasonally adjusted growth rate of 2.5 percent, or 31,900 added jobs, relative to July 2015. Over the same time period Las Vegas and Reno/Sparks both grew faster than the state as a whole, at 2.7 percent and 4.3 percent respectively. This growth rate translates to 24,400 new jobs in



Las Vegas and 9,000 new jobs in Reno. Carson City's employment remained the same over the year. In Las Vegas, goods-producing industries added 7,300 jobs since July 2015, while service providers added 19,700<sup>1</sup>. In Reno/Sparks, 1,000 goods-producing jobs were added over the same time period while 7,200 service providing jobs were gained. In Carson City, about 200 goods-producing jobs were lost while service providers gained 300 jobs over the year.


As would be expected, healthcare employment in the Silver State is up compared to pre-recessionary levels. Nevada's share of jobs in healthcare stood at 6.2 percent in 2007 (80,100 jobs out of 1,284,000). As of 2015, healthcare has expanded its role in the Silver State's economy, accounting for eight percent of total employment (99,100 out of 1,245,000 jobs). While Nevada healthcare employment has increased significantly over the last eight years, employment shares in this industry have been lagging be-

hind the national average. Nevada's share of healthcare jobs was 4.4 percentage points lower than the national average in 2007 (6.2 percent vs 10.7 percent). In 2015, the share in the Silver State is closer to the U.S. (eight percent vs 11.9 percent) – indicating healthcare industry employment remains underserved in the State, although improvement is evident.

At the county level, Carson City had higher pre-recessionary levels of healthcare employment than any of the other metro areas, at 9.5 percent. This trend continued in 2015. In fact, the current


percentage of healthcare industry jobs in the State Capital is relatively close to the national share, up 2.1 percentage points from 2007, to 11.6 percent. Since the economic downturn, the share of healthcare industry employment in Washoe increased similarly to Carson City, up from 7.9 percent in 2007, to 10 percent in 2015, or 2.1 percentage points. Healthcare employment in Clark realized the least improvement over the course of the recession. During pre-recessionary highs, healthcare accounted for 6.6 per-



cent of total employment in Clark. Over 2015, healthcare employment in the county increased 1.8 percentage points, to 7.7 percent.

This month, the unemployment rates in the State's metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs) decreased both on a month-over-month basis and year-over-year<sup>2</sup>. In Las Vegas the unemployment rate is at 6.7 percent, down 0.2 percentage point from June, and down 0.4 percentage point from July of last year. The Reno/Sparks rate is down 0.4 percentage point from last month and 0.8 percentage point from last year, at 5.5 percent. Carson City's unemployment rate is at 6.5 percent, down 0.4 percentage point over-the-month and 0.7 percentage point from this month last year.

Unemployment decreased in all Nevada counties except Esmeralda, where it is up 1.1 percent from last month to 6.3 percent in July. All counties remain below ten per-



cent unemployment. Rates ranged from a low of 4.9 percent in White Pine to a high of 9.6 percent in Mineral. In addition to White Pine, Elko and Washoe counties also maintain relatively low unemployment rates at five percent and 5.5 percent, respectively. The highest unemployment rates, along with Mineral, are found in Nye at 8.3 percent and Lyon at 8.1 percent. Aside from these top three, all other counties hold unemployment rates below seven percent.


Year-to-date, online job posting activity<sup>3</sup> is up in 16 of 17 counties in July. Clark job postings increased more than any other county (+7,800) at 92,100 ads, up from 84,300 during the same time period last year. Washoe also realized significant growth in postings, with an increase of 4,500 ads, totaling 24,100 postings. Pershing was the only county to realize over-the-year declines in job postings, with 30 less postings than last year.

<sup>2</sup> The State's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate is 6.5 percent in July, up from 6.4 percent in June and down from 6.7 percent in July 2015. Unemployment rates for the State's metropolitan areas and counties reported here are not adjusted for seasonality. Hence, comparisons to the State's seasonally adjusted rate should be avoided. Legitimate comparisons, however, can be made to the State's unadjusted rate – 6.5 percent in July, down from 6.8 percent in June and down from seven percent in July 2015.

<sup>3</sup> The Department of Employment, Training, and Rehabilitation is a client of Burning Glass Technologies.
