VI. *Discussion/Possible Action – Summer Business Institute Proposal Eric James

Eric James asked for a motion to approve the Summer Business Institute Proposal for \$249,998.69 to serve 140 youth with summer employment and workforce readiness/leadership training. VIII. Review Governor’s Reserve Year-Round Monthly Reports Eric James

- Ready For Life
 - RFL Southern Nevada staff in conjunction with wCx staff participated in the Tri Annual NyE Communities Coalition meeting in Beatty Nevada. This meeting allowed for the message of RFL to be spread to other organizations working in Nye County and neighboring Esmeralda County. As part of our contracted deliverables we are to: Internal and external communication and coordination, including convening and connecting cross-region and statewide. Participation in Tri Annual NyE Communities Coalition meeting serves to meet that deliverable.
 - As a partner in the Go To College Initiative (CSN) we have recruited subject matter experts (SME) to work with CSN Department Faculty and staff in school presentations. The purpose of these presentations is to show students the connection between education and careers. SME’s and their CSN staff counterparts engage the students in conversation explaining the connection and encouraging them to consider post secondary education.
 - Washoe County RFL is working with WCSD to facilitate a March community event which will focus on bringing together various service providers and non-profits with a goal of increasing partnerships in relation to the WCSD strategic plan. The Washoe RFL Employment workgroup is working to help service providers get their foot in the door with businesses and industries that they have had difficulty placing youth in job shadowing and internship positions. Washoe County RFL staff participated in ACT Conference held at UNR and represented NPEF/Ready for Life at a resource table as well as participated in break out presentations and discussions.
- YouthBuild
 - To date 14 participants have obtained their High School diploma or GED, 14 participants have moved on to employment/education. The enrollment goal of 68 has been reached and the 2nd cohort is underway. 63 participants have received OSHA 10 certification.
 - At present our placement in education or employment is 63%, attainment of degree or certificate is 88% and literacy and numeracy gains are 56%.
- Junior Achievement
 - Junior Achievement staff is finalizing schools to participate in the Job Shadow program. We have met with school teachers from Cheyenne HS and Valley HS and are just awaiting approval from their administration final events.
 - Awaiting confirmation from Virtual/Distance Learning HS to determine which job shadow date they would like to join.
 - Completed Job Shadow on April 12th at AT&T with Mojave HS
 - Completed Job Shadow on April 14th at Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Dept with Desert Pines HS.
 - Completed Job Shadow on May 4th at Hard Rock Café Las Vegas Strip with Canyon Springs HS.
 - Finalizing details with United Healthcare for Job Shadow with Rancho HS on May 17th.
 - Finalizing details with Caesars Entertainment for Job Shadow with Canyon Springs HS on May 18th.
 - Finalizing details with AT&T for Job Shadow with Mojave HS on May 18th.
 - With the education budget cuts looming and staffing reductions, it has been challenging to confirm participation with schools. Teachers across the entire school district are unsure of the future of their positions for the upcoming school year and are reluctant to commit to any additional programs. Administrators are also overwhelmed with trying to address staffing and budget cuts and are not as accessible to teachers for program approval.
 - The students were very impressed with the Job Shadow that we did at AT&T on April 12th. In fact, one student who will be graduating this June enjoyed the program and his visit to AT&T so much that he is planning on submitting an application for employment when he graduates next month.

- *workforce*CONNECTIONS
 - Released RFP to procure DoL WIA funds for education, training and employment activities youth ages 14-21 years old.
 - Contracts are through September 30 of the following year. This change was necessary to incorporate summer youth employment opportunities in the programming and increase the likelihood of successful performance outcomes
 - 15 proposals were received by deadline April 18, 2011
 - Five proposals were approved at the wCx Youth Council meeting June 8th.
